Tomb Sweeping Day

清明节 qīng míng jié



Qingming Jie is on April 5. This custom can be traced back to over one thousand years ago. In Tang Dynasty, the habit of taking an excursion on this day was developed. At this time, spring returns and dominates the earth again. The feel of growing life is in the air, with sap ascending in trees and buds bursting. Besides enjoying the new spring(踏青 tà qīng), Chinese people would take this time to go back to their hometown and visit loved one's graveyard上坟 (shàng fén) In front of loved ones' graves, they put food in a clean plate with chopsticks aside, fill cups with wine or tea, lit special candle sticks (烧香shāo xiāng), knee down, have three bows and would say to the departed love ones like this:" xxx, I come to see you. I bring you your favorite food and drinks, please enjoy yourself". Then they will burn the paper money as

if they would like to make sure that the departed loved ones wouldn't worry about lacking of money for their heavenly life.
